PBS 45 & 49 to Offer Free Heart Health Program at Eastwood YMCA

The Hidden Epidemic: Heart Disease in America is part of station's Aging Smart initiative

KENT, Ohio — Feb. 13, 2007 — Community members are invited to attend a free program on heart health sponsored by PBS 45 & 49. The event will be held on Wednesday, Feb. 28 from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. at the Eastwood YMCA, 995 Youngstown Warren Rd., Niles. It includes a screening of the film **The Hidden Epidemic: Heart Disease in America** and a question-and-answer segment with a local health expert. Participants also will receive free take-home materials about heart health. Pre-registration is required; to reserve a seat, call 1-800-554-4549.

Heart disease is the number-one killer of Americans, and more than half of all people who die of the disease succumb without warning. The other half have the disease lurking in their bodies for many years before it strikes. There is no cure, but doctors are learning remarkable new things about the disease: where it starts, how it occurs and what that means for everyone.

The Hidden Epidemic is a part of PBS 45 & 49's Aging Smart initiative, a service for its viewers who are over the age of 55. The initiative includes on-air programming, community events and a free quarterly newsletter — all designed to help community members age positively, healthfully and wisely. The on-air programming runs Mondays through Fridays from 2 p.m. to 3 p.m., with additional programming found throughout the primetime and weekend broadcast schedule.
