# PBS Western Reserve to Celebrate 50th Anniversary of WNEO's First Broadcast with Open House

Kent, OH — Nov. 2, 2023 — PBS Western Reserve invites community members to attend its open house to celebrate the 50th anniversary of WNEO's first broadcast. The event will be held on Thursday, Nov. 30, from 11 AM to 4 PM at PBS Western Reserve, 1750 W. Campus Center Dr., Kent.

Attendees can enjoy a behind-the-scenes station tour, an interactive studio experience, light refreshments and these special events:

In addition to the free events, from 10 AM to noon the station will host Happy Accidents: A Bob Ross-Inspired Workshop. The cost to participate is \$100, which includes all supplies and a one-year PBS Western Reserve membership at the Passport level. WEAO, which went on the air in 1975, is licensed to the city of Akron and serves the Cleveland-Akron-Canton designated television market. All programming is simulcast on the two stations, which operate under one 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation, Northeastern Educational Television of Ohio Inc. The organization has an Educational Services Department that is funded by the Ohio Department of Education and serves K-12 students in 10 Ohio counties.
